The Ontario Chamber of Commerce, in partnership with our Chamber achieved meaningful advocacy wins on behalf of Ontario's employer community.

- + The early removal of the Debt Retirement Charge on non-residential electricity users.
- + Increasing Financial Literacy for Ontario Grade 10 Students, 28 pilot projects.
- + Budget 2017 commits the government to develop regional economic development plans.



FEDERAL LEVEL

We exist to ensure Canadian businesses have access to the people, customers, infrastructure, capital and technology needed to compete and win in domestic and global markets.

The government announced plans to revise its proposed tax reforms and to reduce the small business tax rate as a result of the comments and concerns expressed through the #ProtectGrowth campaign and through consultations. The chamber network remains vigilant as to the details and applications of the measures are still unclear.


